### About The Links

THE LINKS, INCORPORATED is an international women's service organization, which addresses issues affecting persons of African-American heritage. It is one of the oldest and largest volunteer service organizations for women who are committed to enriching, sustaining, and ensuring the culture and economic survival of African Americans and other persons of African ancestry. Founded by the late Margaret Roselle Hawkins and the late Sarah Strickland Scott in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, on November 9, 1946, we now have a membership of over 15,000 women in 287 chapters located in 42 states, the District of Columbia, the Commonwealth of the Bahamas. The organization has been incorporated since 1951.

Born in the aftermath of World War II, the organization has continually responded to its national environment and its high sense of purpose. For over six decades, The Links, Incorporated has been committed to education, cultural enrichment, health and wellness, and civic activities, striving to formulate a positive, productive, and culturally diverse society and to make the name Links synonymous with friendship and purposeful service.

The organization renders service through five program facets: Services to Youth, National Trends and Services, International Trends and Services, The Arts, and Health and Human Services. Through these facets, the organization is involved in efforts to address issues and concerns that impact the quality of life and render assistance globally to humankind--especially those in African and Caribbean countries.

Throughout its history, The Links, Incorporated, has attracted distinguished and dedicated women who have achieved and made a difference in their communities. They are role models, mentors, activists, and volunteers who continue to work to enhance the quality of life in the larger community.

On March 2, 1974, **The Bergen County, NJ Chapter** was chartered. Since its inception, we have sought to live up to the goals and objectives of the organization and address issues that impact the quality of life in our community. ## 'Mother's Day Luncheon' Chapter History

The seeds for starting the Bergen County, New Jersey Chapter of the Links, Incorporated were planted nearly two years before its founding. While visiting New Jersey in the fall of 1972, Link Adeline Jordan, a member of the Angel City Chapter of The Links, Inc., was encouraged by National President Link Helen Edmonds, to help her in increasing the number of chapters nationwide. During a New Jersey visit with her daughter, Carolyn Booker, and long-time family friend, Frances Raines, the trio discussed establishing a chapter in the Bergen County area.

Coincidently, county residents Ethel Davis and later Ruth Lowe had also inquired about starting a Links chapter. The National office suggested that these pioneering women work together to sow the seeds of friendship and service. They compiled a list of professional women who were leaders in the community and on the morning of March 2, 1974, the group was installed at a ceremony held at the home of Frances Raines in Teaneck, New Jersey.

"The excitement and enthusiasm of the prospective members were noticeable," recalled one charter member. "We were fortunate to have the National Executive Council members in attendance." The distinguished Link guests were just completing an executive board meeting and arrived at the installation from New York City. They were Founder Sarah Scott, National President Helen Edmonds, Past President Vivian Beamon, Vice President Verna Codwell, Financial Secretary Ruth W. McCants, Legal Counsel Allie Weeden, Eastern Area Director Thelma Hardiman, and members Hortense Young and Gertrude Thomas.

On this historic day, the Executive Council conducted the installation services for the following members of the Bergen County New Jersey Chapter: Mmes. Cecilia Artis, Mabel Beale, Maxine Beavers, Alease Black, Carolyn Booker, Lydia Brown, Patricia Chaney, Ethel Davis, Elaine Gunthorpe, Barbara Jones, Wilma Jones, Barbara Kay, Theodora Lacey, Joan Lockett, Ruth Lowe, Joann Peay, Althea Perry, Frances Raines, Mabel Randolph, Juanita Robinson, Katherine Smith, Imogene Smith, Jacquelyn Styles, Jewel Thompson and Lucinda White.

The first official meeting as a Link Chapter was held on March 23, 1974 at the home of Link Barbara Kay. At that time, two charter members were installed —Althea Jackson and Mildred Laster.

Officers of the Chapter were elected and duly installed on May 18, 1974. The first elected officers were:

President: Theodora Lacey Treasurer: Joan Lockett Recording Secretary: Juanita Robinson

Vice President: Carolyn Booker Financial Secretary: Frances Raines Corresponding Secretary: Ruth Lowe

The organization was now strategically ready to weld The Links' chain of friendship, through the four-point program; Services to Youth, The Arts, National Trends and International Trends. The addition as a Link in the friendship chain has served as a beacon in the Bergen County community toward improving the quality of life for all citizens.

"When we light the candles symbolic of the true spirit of Links: Friendship, Service, Commitment, Dedication- its ascending flame expresses our gratitude, appreciation and reverence for the National Founders, Sarah Scott and Margaret Hawkins, as well as for Link Adeline Jordan, Angel City Chapter and Dr. Helen Edmonds, Past National President, who offered encouragement to us in founding the Bergen County Chapter of The Links Inc.," said one charter member. "These remarkable women saw in us the qualities of our national founders, enabling us to effect the welding of Links into a chain of friendship of measureless scope. In addition, they have instilled in us the ability to project an idea of giving self in limitless service and fostered the notion that our relationships with others might be nurtured, strengthened and enriched. For this we are grateful to all the members of the Bergen County Chapter

— who have rallied to the call of friendship, service, commitment and dedication to Linkdom."

## Mother's Day Luncheon' Highlights

#### NATIONAL TRENDS & SERVICES

Continuing a partnership with the Bergen County Office of Human Services and its Project Homeless Connect program, this facet organized a "feed the homeless" day wherein all chapter members came together to provide food and drinks and manned the lunch line serving smiles and food to those in need. During a second opportunity to serve the community, the facet created a partnership with the men of Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity to feed the homeless at Mount Olive Baptist Church in Hackensack. National Trends and Services continued its efforts to engage and enlighten the public by joining forces with the NAACP to increase its membership.

#### **SERVICES TO YOUTH**

This facet takes on the rigorous task of facilitating The Links, Inc. yearly student scholarship program. A 3-6 month long initiative, this process includes updating the applications; distributing them throughout the community at schools and churches; receiving, reviewing and interviewing the applicants, and selecting those students who would best be served by our organization's scholarship dollars. This year 20 deserving students will receive scholarships totaling more than \$20,000. This facet continues to serve youth at every opportunity and joins forces with other facets to help facilitate their programming when it involves community youth.

#### **HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES**

A fun and favorite highlight of this facet is its cooperative partnership with the American Heart Association in sponsoring an annual Night of Dance. This night is not only focused on healthy eating but the energetic and increased heart rates after dancing. This facet also partnered with our National Trends facet in facilitating the NAACP during its membership drive and invited representatives to be a part of the evenings program.

With a busy year that included hosting a movie titled "Alive Inside" which addresses the use of music in working with mentally ill and demented patients, Health and Human Services created a day long symposium on Alzheimer's Awareness at Holy Name Hospital. This program was a collaborative effort with the Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority and Holy Name Hospital. The program served more than 125 community members providing information about Alzheimer's; information for caretakers of Alzheimer's patients and providing resources for help for those stricken by the disease.

Along with participation in the Breast Cancer Awareness Walk sponsored by The American Cancer Society, the chapter made a \$500 donation to Breast Cancer. This facet also was our chapter liaison with the National and local chapters of Alzheimer's Research and participated in their walk alongside other supporters, giving The Bergen County chapter of The Links, Inc. increased visibility.

### 'Mother's Day Luncheon' Highlights

#### THE ARTS

This facet introduced teens from the local New Jersey area into the world of poetry, art, and the making of documentaries. Attending a special performance of the Dance Theatre of Harlem, chapter members were thrilled to have a "talk back" session after the event with Carmen de Lavallade, a recent Kennedy Center honoree. For the second night at the Dance Theatre of Harlem, this facet hosted a group of students in conjunction with the Services to Youth facet to witness live theatre and have photo opportunities afterwards. Continuing their mission to engage students in the world of arts, there was the participation in the 2018 National Poster Art Contest where our chapter members hosted an exhibition featuring artwork by local students.

The facet also facilitated participation in the Young Master Writers Competition, Poetic Justice. Students were encouraged to share their artistic talents and winners of the competition received a monetary reward.

One of their staple programs, expected each year by the community, is the Links continuing participation in the Teaneck Film Festival. During this program year the facet committee members hosted a viewing of two films; BADD Sonia Sanchez and Back to Natural, a documentary about hair, offering a chance to meet Ms. Sanchez and also the creators of the documentary.

#### INTERNATIONAL TRENDS

This facet of our Links chapter has continued with its superb programming to aid and enlighten children from our communities and from around the world. Creating a program for middle school students, the facet hosted a panel discussion on International Careers and also participated in the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals program, offering a global curriculum to middle school students. Providing an opportunity for students to participate in the World Aids Day conference, 3 students from Children's Aid and Family Services were hosted at the event by this facet.

On a Links Mission to Jamaica, IT donated and collected from chapter members more than 111 Barbie dolls and action figures to give to students in Jamaica who might otherwise never get new toys. The arm of benevolence continued with a collection of \$540 from chapter membership for One America Appeal to benefit victims of Hurricane Irma. In partnering with The Arts, International Trends supported their efforts during the Teaneck International Film Festival by assisting with the meet and greet with Sonia Sanchez.

All five chapter facets join forces in various ways to create community service programming that is successful and sustainable year after year.

Their dedication to collaborating and completing their projects gives testimony that the chapter's motto of friendship and service are being fulfilled.

Gervonn Charise Romney Rice is a lifelong resident of Teaneck, NJ. A proud product of its public schools and graduate of Teaneck High School. She received her Bachelor of Science degree in Commerce from Rider University. After being the Director of Volunteer Services for Center for Hope and Safety for the last 5 years, she is now pursuing her own non-profit to provide housing and career options for developmentally different young adults.

Rice puts family second only to serving God and has been a member of Christian International since 1996, currently serving in its Ushers and Greeters Ministry. Married to Willie Rice for 27 years, they are the proud parents of 3 sons Gerard 25, Jordan 20 and Jullian 18 all products of Teaneck Public Schools and she is very happy that they

are all on their journey to independence. She took time off to raise her sons and Jullian, the youngest, had complications at birth and wasn't expected to live. Her prayer was, "Lord if you let him live, I promise to make his life worth living." Thus, began the numerous doctor visits, therapists, IEP meetings and advocacy. Through advocating for her own children, she found herself sharing all the resources she researched and advocating for classrooms, schools and ultimately the school district as a Board of Education Trustee.

Despite having a child who needed more support, she tried to insure a balance of time and attention to all three sons. This was the main reason she joined the Bergen-Passaic Chapter of Jack and Jill of America, Inc. She was drawn to their mission of "nurturing future" African-American leaders by strengthening children through leadership development, volunteer service, philanthropic giving and civic duty" and was seeking the support of a village for her two older sons.

Rice is a public servant leader with a long history of community advocacy and service, all stemming from improving the quality of life for her children and demonstrating to them by example. Setting an early example for her sons, about the importance of advocacy and community service, Rice has held positions over the years that include PTO Council President, NAACP member, Exec. Board of Special Parents of Teaneck, Teaneck Board of Education Trustee, appointed and then elected to Teaneck Town Council.

Gervonn has truly taken to heart and feels passionate about demonstrating to her sons that "service is the rent we pay to be living. It is the very purpose of life and not something you do in your spare time." — Marian Wright Edelman

### The Hadnott Family Foundation Scholarship Award

The Hadnott Family Foundation Scholarship Award was started in the year 2001 to honor our deceased Link Sister Earlene Hadnott who lost her valiant battle with breast cancer in February 2000.

In August 2000, The Hadnott Family Foundation, Inc. was established under the leadership of its president, Bennie Hadnott, CPA. Its purpose is to help reduce the number of breast cancer related deaths among African-American women through preventive initiatives, early detection and breast cancer research. Located in Teaneck, NJ the Foundation is comprised of members of the Hadnott family, African-American business leaders, community advocates and health-care professionals.

### The Dr. Helen O. Dickens Memorial Scholarship

 $This\ scholarship\ was\ established\ for\ an\ outstanding\ minority\ student\ pursuing\ a\ career\ in\ medicine.\ The$ 

recipient of this scholarship will have a desire to transform lives through quality medical care and patient education.



Helen O. Dickens was a 1934 graduate of the University of Illinois-School of Medicine, the only African-American woman in her graduating class. She spent two years after graduation at Provident Hospital in Chicago, and then practiced with Dr. Virginia Alexander in a birthing-home practice in North Philadelphia. In 1943, she married Dr. Purvis Sinclair Henderson, a pediatric neurosurgeon and a fellow resident at Harlem Hospital in New York City.

In 1945, she became the first female African American boardcertified OB-GYN in Philadelphia. In that same year, Dickens became director of the department of obstetrics and gynecology at Mercy Douglass Hospital in Philadelphia. In 1950, she became the

first African American person admitted to the American College of Surgeons. By 1969 she was associate dean in the Office for Minority Affairs at the University of Pennsylvania, and within five years had increased minority enrollment from three students to sixty-four.

In patient care, Dr. Dickens concentrated on preventing some of the problems she had seen so frequently in her obstetrics and gynecology practice. Hoping to educate young women to empower themselves, she led extensive research into teen pregnancy and sexual health issues. Also, Dickens instigated a program funded by the NIH that encouraged doctors to perform Pap smears to test for cervical cancer.

In 1999, The Helen O. Dickens Center for Women's Health at the Hospital of the University of Pennsylvania was named in honor of the 50 years she "dedicated to healing, helping and guiding women of all ages."
